Rights and Responsibilities

Volunteering is a two-way relationship. As a volunteer you can expect to have a number of rights but there are certain responsibilities as well.

Volunteers have the RIGHT to:

- Worthwhile work and stimulating activities, using any special skills they may have
- Choice regarding the activities they take part in—to be able to say NO if they are uncomfortable
 with the task assigned
- Be provided with orientation which will help them understand the agency and work they will do
- Receive adequate training, support and supervision to enable them to do their job effectively
- Be given **feedback** and recognised for their contribution
- Be protected by adequate insurance
- Work in a healthy and safe environment
- Have authorised out-of-pocket expenses reimbursed

Volunteers have the RESPONSIBILITY to:

- Be dependable—notify the agency if unable to attend
- Be willing to undertake relevant orientation, training, support and supervision
- Maintain confidentiality and be non-judgemental
- Work in accordance with Health and Safety regulations
- Work in accordance with the agency's policies, procedures, instructions and rules
- Say no when they cannot commit to a task
- Respect the rights, privacy and dignity of clients and colleagues



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
